## Featured Speakers



### **Hannah Maxey, PhD, MPH, RDH** Indiana University School of Medicine

Dr. Maxey is Associate Professor of Family Medicine and Director of the Bowen Center for Health Workforce Research and Policy at the Indiana University School of Medicine. She is a nationally recognized expert in health workforce policy with more than two decades of experience in health care and public health.

A licensed dental hygienist in Indiana for over 20 years, she spent nearly a decade practicing in public health clinics operated by the Marion County Public Health Department. Her experience provided perspective on the intersection and relationship between health care and public health, as well as the critical role the health workforce has in ensuring availability and accessibility in both public health and health care services.

She has been actively engaged in developing strategies and leading health workforce initiatives within multiple states since 2014.



### **Representative Larry Bucshon, MD** U.S. House of Representatives (R-IN)

Congressman Bucshon represents the Eighth District of Indiana, which encompasses all or part of 19 counties in Southwest and West Central Indiana.

Since coming to Congress, he has been a champion for advancing patient-centered health care reforms that will give patients and their doctors the freedom to make their own health care decisions. He has also been a leader in the fight to end the opioid epidemic, and is one of eight lawmakers from around the nation recognized by the Coalition to Stop Opioid Overdose in 2016 for his work on the issue.

Before coming to Congress, he was a practicing physician and surgeon specializing in cardiothoracic surgery. He is board certified in Cardiothoracic Surgery by the American Board of Thoracic Surgery.



### **Stacy L. Lloyd, MPH** American Medical Association

Stacy L. Lloyd is the Director of Digital Health and Operations at the American Medical Association. She is passionate about collaborating with physicians, innovators, patients, and other industry stakeholders to ensure health care technology is successfully implemented and utilized in practice.

She has also held various roles in finance and operations in the health system environment as well as VP of Business Development at Savvy Cooperative, a startup that helps health care companies connect with patients to gain insights and improve the patient experience. She is also a board-certified patient advocate and serves as Chair of Board of Directors for the VHL Alliance, a nonprofit dedicated to supporting the VHL community including patients, families, and clinicians.
